VISA

BY PLANE

It is very easy to get to Budapest by plane, several low-cost airlines have great offers and services.

BY RAIL

There are 3 main international railway stations in Budapest: Eastern (Keleti), Western (Nyugati) and Southern (Déli). More than 50 trains a day provide direct links between Budapest and 25 other European capital cities. Trains to Vienna (250 km) run every 3 hours, 7 times a day. There is also a popular network of Inter City trains linking Budapest with the main Hungarian towns.

BY CAR

Hungary has 5 motorways and 4 national roads. For using the motorways you have to purchase a motorway vignette online or you also can buy it at border crossing points or at petrol stations near the border for the use of M1, M3, M5, M6 and M7. BY BUS

In Budapest, international and domestic buses depart from and arrive to the Népliget Bus Station. Other domestic bus stations are at Árpád híd, Stadionok in Pest and Etele tér in Buda. Volánbusz Rt. has scheduled passenger coach services to and from the following countries: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, France, Germany, Great Britain, Greece, Italy, Lithuania, Macedonia, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, and Ukraine.
